Fundraising Success for Mission Alaska

This past May 6th, MATA hosted its first-ever fundraising dinner for the purpose of raising support for Alaska ministry projects. Guests were served a professionally prepared meal and heard presentations by Dary Finck, MATA Executive Director, and John and Margaret Lewis, MATA staffers, on the dire needs in Alaska. This year, the Alaska mission objectives are multi-fold. First, to train and disciple MATA students in a missions context while ministering to missionaries who are serving in native villages. Second, to use our Cessna 206 (N39MP) to fly native villagers to Bible camps to hear the Gospel. Finally, to send John and Margaret Lewis back to the village of Marshall to comfort and encourage the people in the hope of the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. This couple served faithfully in Marshall for two years (2012-2014) as church planters and the people still remain dear in their hearts.

The target goal for the fundraiser was \$12,000 and the Lord brought in *over \$16,000* in generously donated gifts! *We are so thankful* for our donors, Atonement Free Lutheran Church for the use of their facility, and to all who served making this a “well-done” occasion for all.

Please pray for all the trip preparations, that God would prepare the students who will take part in the trip, and for John and Margaret, that God will protect and strengthen them for bringing the ministry of the Gospel to the people of Marshall.

August 1st - 18th MATA student ministry trip to AK

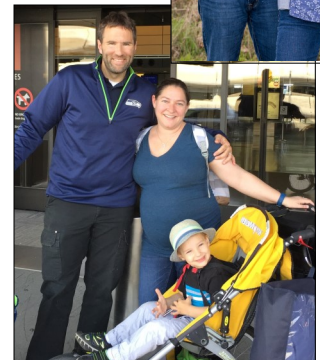
MATA ALUMNI ON HOME ASSIGNMENT

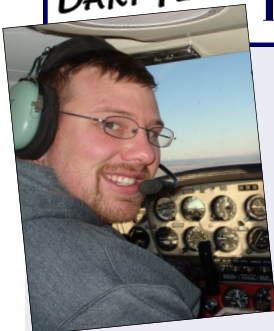


NEW STAFF have arrived & NEW STUDENTS are on the way!

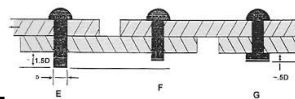
DARY FINCK Director's Corner

Students cannot progress in flight training if their training aircraft are unable to fly due to required maintenance. The MATA maintenance staff works diligently with every inspection and repair to assure MATA aircraft are airworthy for the training of pilots for aviation ministry!

FEB. 2017 Alaska Missions Trip RECAP

Naknek, AK is cold and isolated in the winter. The MATA maintenance team traveled to this fishing town nestled on the inlet of Bristol Bay to perform various maintenance projects critical to the AFLC (Assoc. of Free Lutheran Churches) and FLAPS (Free Lutheran Association of Pilot Supporters) ministry in that area. Aircraft and radio services are a necessary means used to "distribute" the Gospel to the isolated peoples in and around Naknek. So, *we give thanks* to God in reporting that our concentrated maintenance work performed on two aircraft and the Christian radio station, *during that one week trip*, saved months of work, otherwise.
