Instrument Rating: an add-on to the private pilot license that allows you to fly into clouds and low visibility conditions.

Commercial License: with this license, you can fly for compensation or hire. Certified Flight Instructor (CFI) & CFI Instrument (CFII): these allow you to teach Private/Commercial and Instrument students respectively.

MATA was invited to Glad Tidings Assembly of God Church in Darrington, WA this past May 6 for a missions emphasis Sunday. Executive Director Dary Finck shared during the service about missions and the ministry of MATA. This Sunday coupled MATA's visit with a community

Doug Nunziato, MATA's Chief of Maintenance, and his family will be taking a ministry trip to Alamos, Mexico from June 28 - July 9 to serve alongside MATA graduate Daniel Jones (pictured left). Daniel and his wife Ana's ministry through Rancho Maranatha (Calvary Chapel Missions) is to extend the gospel, disciple believers, and

plant churches in and around Alamos to include mountain villages. Daniel uses an experimental 2-seat aircraft to fly an average of 20-30 minutes to villages that otherwise would be an all-day drive! One of the goals for the week is to assess how MATA can further support Daniel's work from an aviation perspective in the future.

Mission Alaska

At KAKO Bible Camp: From August 1st-5th about 50 Native Alaskan women will come to KAKO for a berry picking retreat. Most of these women come to KAKO looking for a reprieve from the normal struggles they face every day in village life. MATA staff Margaret Lewis and Stacie Elliott, along with 4 other camp counselors, will help lead the retreat. As a means to minister to these women, they will use ministry tools and activities that help in sharing the Gospel - the hope our lives find in Christ. John Lewis, MATA staff, will also be at KAKO during this week serving in various ways around camp. Gary Elliott, MATA's Chief Flight Instructor, along with MATA students will be offering aviation services to KAKO during the berry picking retreat. Please pray for clarity in planning on the flight side as the details are still being worked out. Please pray for the team at KAKO as they minister and share Christ's love during this retreat and that lives will be changed as a result.

In Marshall, AK: After KAKO, John and Margaret Lewis will return to Marshall, AK to serve for 2 weeks. They have remained in contact with the people of Marshall and look forward to being face-to-face once again to encourage and minister to their needs both physically and spiritually. They plan to use their gifts in music, construction, and counseling along with a Bible study to reach out to those who lack hope and feel so alone.
