The best laid plans ...

... when interrupted, make for the best missionary pilot training. This was the case when Flight Instructors Gary Elliott (with wife Stacie) and Vic Santie departed Arlington, WA on October 10th with MATA students Vitaliy, Matthew, Brock, and Daniil. The trip was a long weekend venture after many

hours of planning with the southernmost stopping point being McNeal, Arizona, home of Ethnos360 Aviation.

In the early hours of Thursday the 10th, both MATA teams "broke ground" heading southeast through the Cascades with the students at the controls. Gary and Vic coached them in their respective planes on staying focused on maintaining heading and altitude over the varied terrain. More than eight hours later the teams landed safely in Prescott, Arizona for the night. The next day's goal: reach Ethnos360 by late morning.

During the pre-flight run-up Friday morning, N300HP checked good and flew off toward McNeal, but N39MP had an issue. Only one magneto worked and therefore engine power and safety margin were reduced. The crew of N39MP was stuck until Saturday when the repair could be completed. Vic commented,

learned the reality that sometimes, you just don't make it to your destination." So although N39MP never made it to Ethnos360, the crew from N300HP enjoyed their visit and tour at the mission agency with whom the Elliotts once served in the Philippines.

On Saturday both planes departed back to Arlington, N300HP from McNeal and N39MP from Prescott. In the Lord's providence N39MP made it all the way back home Saturday, but this time N300HP ran into a problem. Upon landing in

Medford, Oregon for the night the tailwheel tire blew with no spare on board. They were potentially stuck until Monday, still far from home. On Sunday however, Dary Finck and student Nathan Harmer were able to



take N39MP (which had arrived "providentially" the night before) from Arlington to Medford to repair the blown tailwheel tire. By Sunday night the 13th, all crews were home and planes safely secured in the MATA hangar.
