### More Student News!

In a very uncommon sort of way, a local area aviation maintenance facility offered three of our flight students, Nathan, Melody and Vitaliy, mechanic apprenticeship internships. To be a missionary pilot, most mission agencies also require a potential candidate to become an airframe and powerplant (A&P) mechanic. As an alternative to attending a usually costly aviation technician school, the FAA says an individual can have 30 months of practical experience working on airframes and powerplants (engines) to be able to test for the A&P license. So, for these three students to gain experience while working towards their A&P certificate and get paid in the process is a huge blessing for them regarding cost and time savings while preparing for the mission field!

#### Tailwheel Endorsement






