### **ALASKA UPGRADES**

As part of transitioning N2311E to Alaska, several major modifications were accomplished. New installations included two new fuel tanks, a pre-heater kit, shoulder harnesses, plus bigger main and tailwheel tires along with a new tailwheel assembly. A fresh inspection will also be accomplished before the plane heads North.

### "What's a TE?"

Before a prospective missionary pilot/ mechanic can join a mission organization they must pass a Technical Evaluation (TE). This "hands-on" evaluation tests the skill areas of either maintenance or flight (or both) in a candidate applying to serve with a mission organization. MATA offers a TE prep course to prepare candidates for this very important step towards the mission field.
