
On June 15th, after weeks of planning, Scott Quist (MATA Board Chairman & instructor) and Vitaliy departed MATA for Alaska in N39MP. Plans already had changed as Canada's strict border crossing mandates diverted the team up the weather-risky Pacific coast to Ketchikan, AK. But God opened a weather window they flew straight through. Missionary pilots are also typically mechanics, and this paid-off as Vitaliy faced unplanned mechanical issues shortly after arriving in Alaska. Another change in plans arose for Vitaliy with an opportunity to fly for Tanalian Bible Camp in Port Alsworth. This opportunity presented Vitaliy the blessing of seeing lives changed through Tanalian's camp ministry.

En route to Kako Retreat Center via the village of Marshall (to see former MATA staffers John and Margaret Lewis) the unexpected happened again. The team encountered fog which turned a relatively tranquil flight into an intense instrument approach. Once arriving at Kako and after airstrip checkouts with Scott, Vitaliy was released to fly solo. Working at Kako stretched and grew Vitaliy 1) as a pilot, as he flew regularly bringing kids into camp from surrounding villages in less than ideal conditions, 2) as a mechanic, as many planned and unplanned maintenance issues arose, and 3) as a missionary, seeing how dependance on God through the "changed plans" matured him while resulting in Gospel blessings for those he served. On July 19th, Vitaliy returned to MATA, tired yet filled up from his wonderful experience.

MATA MAINTENANCE

Steady maintenance work has kept the team moving at a regular pace in the hangar. Since June alone, there have been multiple oil changes, three annual inspections, and multiple discrepancies that had to be corrected for safe flight training to take to the skies.

Currently in the hangar - and keeping the guys busy - for needed maintenance work are *(pictured right, from front to back)*:

N39MP (Cessna U206) - Recently returned from Alaska, it is getting a full annual inspection done along with repairs and the addition of a vortex generator modification.

N13255 (Cessna 172M) - This aircraft continues to be repaired and is closer every day to being ready to fly. Having received it as a bequeathed gift this spring, we are still petitioning for financial gifts towards the maintenance costs and upgrades to this plane. 
