MATA serving alongside Alumni in Alaska...

The FLAPS (Free Lutheran Association of Pilot Supporters) ministry operates three small airplanes out of the village of Naknek, Alaska flying to about ten villages within 125 miles of Naknek in southwest Alaska. None of these villages are accessible by roads, but all have airports. So, for missionaries and MATA Alumni Jeremy Crowell and Josh Fish, who serve with FLAPS, the airplane is an invaluable "tool" for ministry.

In February, a MATA maintenance team of five guys led by Director Dary Finck took the opportunity to serve alongside Jeremy and Josh in accomplishing what amounted to one month's worth of needed maintenance work in only one week! Two annual inspections were signed off on a Cherokee 6 and Cherokee 140, and a number of discrepancies were

addressed on the aircraft to include the installation of a new windshield on a Cessna 150. Other projects were accomplished as well, including maintenance on the hangar and a parsonage. The team also visited churches in North and South Naknek, fellowshipping with and ministering to local believers. The Lord's provision was evident in not only a safe and effective week of work and ministry, but much-needed fellowship and encouragement for Jeremy and Josh from the MATA team.

Brock commented regarding the Vaughans, "In Palau, Justin grew extremely proficient as an operational pilot and he also led numerous maintenance inspections to keep the flying fleet serving in ministry. Addison regularly taught the children on the island of Angaur about our Savior, Jesus Christ. PMA and the people of Palau have been extremely blessed by their ministry." Please pray for next steps for the Vaughan family as they return home in March.

PMA operates from the Micronesian islands of Palau and Yap. They fly Cessna 206s, a Britten Norman Islander, before leaving two King Airs, and two Queen Airs. The PMA internship program has been invaluable for MATA alums to acquire mission-field experience while building needed flight time and sharpening their maintenance skills.

MATA has achieved PART 141 status!

After four years of dedicated work and effort by instructor Gary Elliott and a successful FAA checkride and evaluation for instructor Vic Santie, MATA received its air agency certificate as an FAA Part 141 provisional flight school on January 10th!


Under Part 141, MATA may apply with a State Approving Agency for authorization to offer flight training to veterans, so they can use their GI Bill educational benefits to help pay for the training. Additionally, after two years on "provisional" status, MATA may apply for certification through U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement to accept international students. In short, Part 141 status gives exciting opportunities for MATA to expand its base of students.

Please pray for our first two enrolled flight students under the 141 program, Casey Underwood and Jed Wilson, who will train using the newly approved Private Pilot syllabus. Please pray,

too, that God would raise up more students called to be missionary pilots!
