

Most aircraft flying on the mission field today have electronically advanced avionics systems and are classified by the FAA as Technically Advanced Aircraft (TAA). We are upgrading our fleet to better prepare our students for flying TAA aircraft on the field.

from our current hangar. The need for expansion is due to the reality that we have outgrown our current "footprint" for student classrooms, office and administrative space, and gathering space for programs like our Bible study. MATA is now a Part 141 Pilot School!

On January 23rd 2025 MATA was certified as an FAA Part 141 Pilot School, after completing 24 months as a Part 141 Provisional Pilot School. This new status will allow MATA to apply for Department of Homeland Security approval to offer flight training for international students. Our mission will continue to be equipping and training evangelical Christian pilots for mission aviation ministry, and we hope to be able soon to offer pilot training to mission-bound Christians from outside the U.S.A., in response to the requests from mission agencies needing national pilot/mechanics in their respective countries.
