

To complete this project, we need to meet the funding goal of \$400,000 for the following work:


- New exterior siding Paint Interior



The MATA maintenance team of **Doug Nunziato**, Director of Maintenance, and students Zach Kupser and Ken Huntsinger traveled to Papua New Guinea (PNG) to assist in the ministry of Samaritan Aviation (SA) www.samaritanaviation.org. The primary focus of the maintenance work was on cleaning, treating, and painting dozens of areas of corrosion on their Cessna 206 amphibian aircraft. Often grueling and monotonous work in the heat and humidity, the team persevered and successfully completed

the project, applying the final coat of paint on the last day before returning home. The work the MATA team accomplished saved months of labor for the SA maintenance crew, which was a huge blessing for their team and ministry.
