• **MATA began 2024 with two significant audits:**

JANUARY - the FAA performed an inspection and approved five aircraft not previously approved under our Part 141 flight training program.

FEBRUARY - MATA was visited by Mission Safety International (MSI). MSI travels the world to educate and provide consulting in order to promote safety and effectiveness in mission aviation. After three days of a thorough audit with the MSI team, MATA came out with high marks overall along with recommendations for change that will improve our effectiveness and safety into the future.

UPDATE: Flight Training in Alaska

N6056R departed MATA for Tanalian Leadership Center (TLC) in Port Alsworth, Alaska in September 2023. **Matt and Abi McWhorter**, on staff with TLC and seconded to MATA to fly and maintain the aircraft, are using "56R" as an extension of their TLC ministry. Since arriving in Alaska, Abi has flown close to 40 hours training three Native Alaskans and one missionary. As Abi stated, *"Having access to this MATA plane has greatly increased our aviation ministry in the areas of discipleship and outreach trips to villages."*

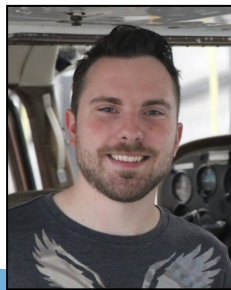
